The international Network of DAAD offices has been meeting in Germany's former capital Bonn to discuss recent developments in higher education. So while I enjoyed a bit of German summer with my colleagues, I'd like to share the latest developments with you:

Every second German masters graduate has spent at least a few months at a university abroad. That is an outstanding result on an international scale and it does not only benefit the mobile students, it also helps shaping internationalisation at their home universities. In fact, most universities have active international partners for student exchange and research cooperation. The Going Global study conducted by our partners at British Council sees German universities among the leading higher education systems in the world. Unfortunately these success stories are not evenly spread across higher education in Germany: We identified two groups, who did not get an equal share of internationalisation efforts and support yet.

Students who want to become teachers are not as mobile as students in other programmes. To address this issue. DAAD has tailor-made an array of support programmes for students in BEd/MEd programmes and for universities offering such programmes. There will be more support for student exchange and practical training at schools abroad. This may open up opportunities for Thai schools and universities who want to attract more German students or teachers in training.

Secondly the DAAD realised that the universities of applied science (UAS, HAW or FH in German) are less prepared for internationalisation and not as well connected as the bigger universities. To improve internationalisation at the UASs, the DAAD has launched an initiative covering student and staff mobility, infrastructure at the universities of applied science and research cooperation. In Germany the term "Science" does not only cover natural sciences but also social sciences and the arts.

Helmut-Schmidt-Programme 2020

The Helmut-Schmidt-Programme, formerly known as Public Policy and Good Governance Programme (PPGG), supports future leaders from Africa, Latin-America, South Asia and Southeast Asia, from countries in the Middle East as well as from the Ukraine, who want to promote democracy and social justice in their home countries.

The scholarship aims at applicants with a Bachelors degree (obtained no longer than six years ago) in Political and Social Science, Economics, Law or other relevant areas. Applicants who have been in Germany for more than 15 months at the time of their application are not eligible to apply.

Application period lasts from 1st June to 31st July 2019. Applicants can choose up to two from eight study programmes. Please follow the application information written on the website of each respective course/university.


Development-Related Postgraduate Courses (EPOS) 2020/21

This scholarship offers foreign graduates from development and newly industrialised countries with at least two years professional experience the chance to take a Master's degree at a state or state-recognised German university, or in exceptional cases to take a doctoral degree in Germany.

The Master programmes, and a few selected PhD courses in this programme, include various subject areas, such as economics, development studies, environmental sciences, agricultural sciences, social sciences, public health, etc. Applicants whose last degree (usually a Bachelor) was completed more than six years ago, or have been in Germany for longer than 15 months at the time of application, <u>are NOT</u> eligible to apply.

To apply for this scholarship programme applicants must submit their applications directly to the programme/university (not DAAD!)
