Visit of DAAD Secretary General to Thailand

Just a few weeks after being inaugurated into her new position, Dr. Dorothea Rüland, General Secretary of DAAD since October 1st, paid a three day visit to Thailand in November. She was accompanied by Ilona Krueger, Head of Southeast Asian section at DAAD.

Dr. Rüland's career at DAAD started as a lecturer at Chiang Mai in the 1980s. Holding still strong ties of friendship, she was happy to meet friends from former days during her visits to institutions and organizations.

One of her main tasks during her visit to Thailand was the opening of the first international conference at CPG, the German Southeast Asian Center of Excellence for Public Policy and Good Governance at Thammasat University on November 15th.

First International Conference at CPG

From November 15-17, 2010, the German-Southeast Asian Center of Excellence for Public Policy and Good Governance (CPG) held its First Annual International Conference on "Constitutionalism and Good Governance" in Bangkok, Thailand. The conference aimed at intercultural and interdisciplinary scientific exchange on issues of constitutional law and its impact on good governance. More than 25 internationally renowned scholars of jurisprudence and political science from 11 countries from Europe, Asia and Australia contributed to the academic success of the conference.

Welcome addresses were delivered by H.E. Peerapan Saleeratthawiphack, Minister of Justice of the Kingdom of Thailand, Dr. Peter Ammon, Secretary of State of the German Federal Foreign Office, Assist. Prof. Nitinant Wisaweisuan, Vice-Rector for International Affairs, Thammasat University, Prof. Dr. Surasak Likasitwatanakul, Dean of Faculty of Law, Thammasat University, Dr. Dorothea Rüland, Secretary General of DAAD, Assist. Prof. Dr. Kittisak Prokati, Faculty of Law, Thammasat University.

Keynote speeches were given by H.E. Dr. *Hassavut* Vititviriyakul, President of Supreme Administrative Court of the Kingdom of Thailand, as well as by Prof. Dr. Rudolf Mellinghoff, Judge of the German Federal Constitutional Court. The event was attended by a great number of guests from the diplomatic corps, from politics and the academic world. The academic part after the opening event was held on Tuesday and Wednesday.

Arriving from Jordan where she joined the fist graduation ceremony at the German Jordanian University, Dr. Rüland's and Ilona Krüger's stay at Bangkok started with a visit to the Thailand Research Fund TRF where they had a chance to discuss joint scholarship programs and higher ecucation development in Thailand with representatives of CHE and universities.

The future development of higher education was the main topic at a visit to Knowledge Network Institute Thailand KNIT where DAAD representatives met with Director Prof. Piyawat Boon-Long. One of the main objectives of KNIT is the development of a higher education ranking system, a project supported by DAAD and German experts.

Three universities with which DAAD has strong relations and collaborations were welcoming the DAAD representatives. At Thammasat University, they paid an informal visit to the Center of Excellence at the Faculty

of Law, supported by DAAD and organized by DAAD special lecturer Dr. Henning Glaser.

At Chulalongkorn University, she and Ilona Krüger met with Dr. Prapod Assavavirulhakarn, Dean of Faculty of Arts. During a visit to the German Section, Dr. Rüland met with colleagues from former times, namely Prof. Ampha Otrakul who was one of the first to teach German language and literature at university level in Thailand.

Last but not least, the guests from Germany paid a visit to The Sirindhorn Thai-German Graduate School of Engineering TGGS at KMUTNB where they met with the two directors Prof. Rolf H. Jansen and Dr. Banleng Sornhil. The MA programs in engineering are supported by DAAD with scholarships and special lecturer Dr. Reinhard Haag.

The dinner at Sra Prathum Palace, the opening of the first international conference of CPG and the alumni dinner at the German Embassy were the evening highlights of the visit. Welcome back to Thailand, Dr. Rüland!

DAAD Alumni Forum in Chiang Mai

On September 17th, 2010, about 70 alumni and guests of DAAD Thailand came to join the alumni forum at Kantary Hills Hotel, Chiang Mai. The topic to be discussed during the day was *Hochschulen im Wandel:* Chancen und Herausforderungen, best to be translated as Higher Education Institutions in Transition: Chances and Challenges.

After two presentations on best practice projects, namely the Uplands Program at CMU and the TGGS Thai German Graduate School at KMUTNB, both supported by DAAD, Mads

Korn from EU Commission to Thailand shared useful information on EU programs like Erasmus Mundus and FP7.

In the following panel discussion with representatives of universities from CMU, Naresuan and KMUTNB, experiences out of the changes within the university administrative system from the past years were shared and discussed with the audience.

With his presentation on 60 Jahre Bundesrepublik Deutschland, German Ambassador Dr. Hanns H. Schumacher opened the evening program, followed by a dinner reception and accompanying live Jazz music.

In August 2010, DAAD Thailand was invited by Friedrich Naumann Stiftung (FNS) to take part at a workshop on alumni activities in Southeast Asia. Participants came from Cambodia, Malaysia, Myanmar, Pakistan, the Philippines and Thailand. The three day workshop took place in Ratchaburi Province.

DAAD Alumni Forum on University Ranking

On December 1st, more than 120 alumni who formerly studied at German higher education institutions followed an invitation to the DAAD alumni forum on the topic "Why do we need higher education rankings?" at Pathumwan Princess Hotel, Bangkok. H.E. Ambassador Dr. Hanns Heinrich Schumacher held an opening speech on the accompanying exhibition "20 Jahre deutsche Wiedervereinigung".

As in almost every country on the path to industrialization, Thailand's higher education institutions are seeking for more internationalization and collaboration. Therefore, quality standards have to be established in order to make education comparable. International higher education rankings are becoming more and more important, with Thailand's higher education institutions not playing a too important role so far.

What are University Rankings all about?

Dr. Nongyao Premkamolnetr from Knowledge Network Institute Thailand KNIT, in her lecture presented several internationally recognized university ranking systems. Dr. Nongyao, who just visited the German think tank Centrum für Hochschulentwicklung CHE in Gütersloh a few weeks before, gave good reasons why the German university ranking system by CHE could be a valuable alternative to the more often quoted one's like the Times Higher Education Ranking or the Shanghai Jiaotong University Ranking, the latter being even more important for Asian countries.

The presentation was followed by a discussion lead by Prof. Piyawat Boon-Long, Director of KNIT. Many of the guests got involved in this lively debate on the question on how much rankings are really a valuable indicator of higher education standards. And although ranking systems seem to be inevitable, it was made quite clear that it needs much more to achieve an excellent standard than just to compare numbers and figures: It also needs dedicated, highly motivated and well trained university teachers to guide and attract capable students.

Since the topics of the alumni events in 2010 were very well received, DAAD Thailand plans to continue its series on university topics and ranking in 2011. Upcoming alumni events are scheduled for June/July 2011 in Chiang Mai and Khon Kaen.

Alumni Workshop at PSU



About 20 alumni joined the alumni workshop on December 17th at Prince of Songkla University PSU in Hat Yai. After a presentation on

"Study and Research in Germany" for a broader audience of nearly 100 students and researchers, DAAD Thailand informed about scholarship programs of DAAD. The presentation was followed by a discussion on "How can internationalization of PSU be supported by alumni activities?"

One idea that is to be realized in the near future is the implementation of ambassadors, i.e. DAAD alumni at PSU who will act as a linkage between DAAD Thailand in Bangkok and students and researchers at the PSU campuses in the South. PSU is one of the top nine research universities in Thailand.



DAAD Scholarships for AIT Students



National Code of Conduct on Foreign Students

On the occasion of the DAAD Network Conference in July 2010, the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) and the German Rectors' Conference (HRK) presented the "National Code of Conduct on Foreign Students at German Universities".



More than 110 German higher education institutions have already pledged to observe the standards it sets in catering for international students. The Code of Conduct defines quality standards regarding information and admission of foreign students, their academic and social support and dealing with complaints.

The General Secretaries of the DAAD and the HRK, Dr. Christian Bode and Dr. Thomas Kathöfer, as well as two representatives of German higher education institutions, stressed that many institutions had used the declaration as an opportunity to review and improve their service and support programmes.

TestAS at CPG

TestAS is a central standardized aptitude test for foreign students. TestAS gives prospective students information about their individual ranking compared to other applicants. With

good results, they can improve their chances of being admitted for studies at a German university.



The German-Southeast Asian Center of Excellence for Public Policy and Good Governance (CPG), located at Thammasat Univer-

sity is an officially acknowledged test center for TestAS.

The first Test for Academic Studies (TestAS) 2011 will take place on February 24th, 2011. The examination is provided free of charge, in English or in German.

Test takers can enroll now at CPG's office at 4th floor of library building of Faculty of Law, Thammasat University Tha Prachan.

Enrollment deadline is January 24th, 2011. Please bring your ID-Card for enrolment. More information on www.testas.de
